Or buy some local newspapers such as Oxford Times, Oxford Mail, and then turn to the page where jobs are being advertised.

- **Shop windows**

Some employers may advertise their job vacancies in their shop window.

- **Ask in store**

Make sure you look smart and have your CV printed out. Then go into several shops ask politely to speak to the manager to see if they have any vacancies
