Year 8 Options Process

After Christmas we will be working with you and your children in helping decide what the subjects they would like to study at GCSE and/or Level 2 BTEC. In order to support you in this process we have the following schedule planned:

At the Options Evening on Thursday 24 January 2019, 5.00-7.00pm you and your child will be able to hear a presentation about choices, how to make them and what to consider. There will also be plenty of opportunities to speak with teachers and students about the different options subjects and get as much information as possible.

There will be lots of support for students in the weeks running up to submission of options choices including tutor sessions and assemblies, taster sessions in all the different subjects and an options booklet which you can read. This options booklet provides a huge amount of detail about the process, the different qualifications and the subjects available.
