

7	Attendance MBA/ HNE	10	<p>RS commented that top level observations do not give sufficient information about the implications of the actions taken. He wanted to know whether there had been any school attendance meetings.</p> <p>HN replied that attendance meetings have not been held with every student but a number had been carried out. The approach was to try and send out letters rather than have meetings. LB pointed out that instead of holding specific meetings which only cover attendance, the issue of attendance has also been raised during other meetings, including those covering behaviour.</p> <p>HN pointed out that attendance is a standing item at the SLT's weekly meeting. However, it is difficult to select a cohort of students within Arbor. Data has to be extracted individually in order to obtain attendance reports.</p> <p>RM commented that attendance is covered within tutor groups but more emphasis needs to be put on recording this accurately. Looking to include attendance in a student's report.</p> <p>With regard to the attendance report, RS noted the number of students in the 90-95 band and asked what happens to these students in school. RM replied that the school needs to separate out those students for whom this is a one off incident. HN pointed out that the school has sent out 100 parental communications on poor attendance, including prosecutions.</p> <p>PD asked whether the 28% of students who attend school 100% of the time are rewarded. LB replied that the school offers incentives and is looking to enrich and boost formal recognition of this. CB stated that there are also mental health issues to be aware of such as students forcing themselves to come in to achieve a 100% attendance record. BP asked whether groups of parents could be invited in to discuss attendance. RM responded that the school have looked into this but have had limited uptake.</p> <p>KF highlighted the number of 'N's shown in the report and wondered why some year teams appear to follow up on this but others don't. HN said that the school was tightening up on this but there has been confusion as to what 'N' means. Y7 and Y8 had no Ns as these need to be transferred to the final code within 48 hours. There should not be any Ns in final absence categorizations.
