Dear Parents, Carers, Staff, Governors and Sixth Form Students

All Parents and Carers

Testing update: we conducted 4,099 lateral flow tests in school in the first 8 days of being back, with no positive cases. Our staff have been testing themselves twice a week, and there have been no positive tests since January, when we had 4 or 5 among the staff. There have been 2 positive cases among students, both from transmission at home, and we have also had a handful of staff who have had to self-isolate because of contacts, but none who have themselves developed symptoms.

Lateral Flow Testing at home: please continue to do Lateral Flow Tests over the two weeks of the Easter holiday. Students will get another pack before the close of day today.

The guidance on whether to do a PCR test after a positive Lateral Flow Test has been confusing; it now says that a positive test, whether at school or at home should be confirmed with a PCR test. Therefore, actions on a positive Lateral Flow Test at home should be:

- Student and the rest of the family should self-isolate.
- Inform school of the result.
- Book a PCR test.
- Continue self-isolating until the result comes back.
- If the PCR is negative, inform school and come back to class.
- If it is positive, continue to self-isolate.

End of term: please remember that Friday 2 April is a public holiday, and school will be closed. Term 5 starts on Monday 19 April.

Free School Meal Vouchers over Half Term: following guidance from the government, Free School meal vouchers will be issued over the half term holiday using Wonde. You will receive a single payment of £30 to cover the two week break. You will receive an email/text from Wonde to say you have been issued with a voucher on Monday 5 April 2021.

Jenner Institute study: if you are healthy, have not yet received a COVID-19 vaccination and are between 18-40 years old, you may be eligible to participate in the Jenner Institute study to determine the safety, tolerability and immunogenicity of intranasal administration of the COVID vaccine ChAdOx1 nCoV-19 in healthy UK adults.
