Dear Parents, Carers, Staff, Governors and Year 12 Students

Year 11 prom and summer show cancellation: we are working now to see if we can run both these events before the end of term in July. I am making no promises, but all of us would like both events to run if at all possible. I hope to let you know the decision in a separate message tomorrow, or perhaps after the weekend. A few words of caution, however:

- This depends entirely on the removal of restrictions on July 19.
- We won't run either event if the local rate in Oxford is high, regardless of the national picture: I have absolutely no desire to host a super-spreader event.
- I'm afraid that the school can in no way pay parents for money spent on prom dresses or other things relating to the event.

Please accept our apologies for the uncertainty; I understand the importance that students attach to their prom, and I hope everyone who contacts staff at school will be able to remain courteous when raising the issue.

Covid vaccinations in school: there are rumours circulating about the roll-out of a vaccination programme in schools for children aged 12-18. We are unaware of any firm plans for this, although we know a programme of vaccinating children is underway in the USA. If it becomes government policy to do something similar in the UK, it will of course require parental consent. Schools will never carry out medical procedures without consent.

We are pleased to announce the installation of a Friends of the Earth, Oxford particulate monitor on site - a first for an Oxford school! Thank you to Dr Janine Aron and Professor John Meullbauer of Friends of the Earth Oxford and INET Oxford, and to Purple Air for their pioneering work on particulates monitoring. Thank you also to Martin from Carbon Alternatives for the installation yesterday.

A massive congratulations to our 6th Form Climate Action students Hannah, Sahana and Lyle for making this happen - you can watch them on BBC South News this evening at 6.30pm!

There is a little bit of techy tweaking to do, but you'll soon see our monitor's data appearing on the [Purple Air website](#).

Parents' Evenings: thank you for all the responses to the parents' evening survey. We had 122 responses, and we will also be establishing a working party of parents from groups who tend to respond less to online surveys (we are hoping to use this model to increase parent participation in school decisions, alongside the governing body, if it proves productive).

In outline, only 10% of respondents would prefer a return to face-to-face meetings, and many parents commented on the increased time efficiency. It seems likely that we will continue with online meetings in the future, and we will think about whether a mixture of the two would be at all feasible. We will be investigating some software which makes the booking system much easier, improves reliability and also closes meetings after 5 minutes, so there is no chance of overrunning. The full results will be shared next week.
