- BEP** - Below Expected Progress

These progress levels have been used in line with the skills that students have been covering in the current academic year.

The report will also have information on the following characteristics:

- Quality of Work

### How can you support your child in their learning?

- discuss this report with them.
- go through your child's attendance record with them. If there are gaps in attendance, explain how important school and education are and that, whilst illness does occur, attending school as much as possible goes hand in hand with better results and learner characteristic grading.
- discuss how having a positive attitude to learning and school will have a direct impact on learner characteristics and achievement points.
- talk about any negative behaviour incidents – what these were, how they could be stopped from happening in the future, and how negative behaviour incidents can impact learner characteristics.

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- ensure your child has a quiet place to study away from gaming, social media and other distractions.
- your child is set homework on Show My Homework/Googleclassroom and we would ask parents and carers to support and encourage their children to complete their homework in good time, working on tasks every day and not leaving it until the last minute.
- encourage your child to read. There is a direct correlation between literacy and achievement – and as a school we recommend 20 minutes reading every day.
