# Paper 1 (Fiction) Q1-5 revision cards

### <u>Fiction Paper – Overview and Timings</u>

You will need to read and understand a **short extract** from a fiction (story) book. You will then be asked 4 questions based on this.

You will also need to plan and write a piece of creative writing (description or storytelling).



### <u>Fiction Paper – Overview and Timings</u>

One extract: 10/15 minutes reading time

Q1: say 4 things you learn (4 marks, 5/5 mins)

Q2: explain use of language (WWHW) (8 marks, 10/12 mins)

Q3: explain use of structure (8 marks, 10/12 mins)

Q4: explain your opinion (20 marks, 25/30 mins)

Q5: your own creative writing - description or storytelling (40 marks, 45/60 mins)

## Fiction - Q2 (language)

Question 2 will ask you to explain the writer's use of language (words and techniques).

The question will get you to focus on a **precise detail in** the story, so read the question carefully.

### Fiction – Q3 (structure)

Question 3 always ask you how the writer has **structured** the text to interest you as a reader.

Structure means the **order of ideas**. So you need to explain the order of ideas, and why this helps to make the story more interesting.

Only spend 10 mins on this question!

# Fiction – Q4 (explain opinion)

Question 4 will say what someone else thought about this story and ask if you agree or disagree.

You need to explain **your opinion** (it's easiest to just agree with the viewpoint given). You also need to explain the writer's use of **language** to support your opinion.

This question is worth the same as Q1-3 together, so you should aim to explain lots of quotations.

### Fiction - Q5

You might be asked to write a **description or part of a story**, but you should take the **same approach** for either.

This question is worth **40 marks** (the same as Q1-4 all put together). You will get marks for **planning ideas** into clear **paragraphs**, then writing carefully and **accurately** so check your **capitals** and use a wide range of **punctuation**.
